



Pool Maintenance Operator

Job Summary

Under supervision, to perform a variety of basic tasks in the maintenance of City swimming pools, pool equipment, jacuzzi and pool facility, and to perform related duties as assigned.

Representative Duties

- Perform all types of pool maintenance, including checking and adjusting pool chemistry, keeping required logs and reports, vacuuming pools, cleaning coping, hosing collectors and decks, and cleaning filters.
- Performs building maintenance work, including: cleaning and organizing storage areas, and general cleaning of the facility.
- Orders supplies for pool and facility. Keeps inventory.
- Makes general repairs to pool and facility as required.

Organizational Relationship

The Pool Maintenance Operator receives assignments from and reports to the Facilities Manager.

Qualifications

Knowledge of:

- Pool maintenance and operations, including the basic tools, equipment and procedures used to maintain pool in a clean and healthful condition.
- General carpentry, painting, plumbing and electrical work.
- Safe work practices.

Ability to:

- Perform heavy manual labor.
- Perform a wide variety of building maintenance work.
- Utilize hand and power tools in performing pool maintenance, carpentry, plumbing, painting, and electrical work.
- Communicate effectively both orally and in writing.
- Work effectively with minimal supervision.
- Read and write English at the level required for successful job performance.
- Establish and maintain cooperative working relationships with others.

Experience and Education

Any combination equivalent to experience and education that could likely provide the required knowledge and abilities. A typical way to obtain the knowledge and abilities would be:

Experience: One year of experience in pool maintenance and general maintenance work.

Education: Graduation from high school or equivalent.

License

A current State of California Driver's license issued by the State Department of Motor Vehicles is required.
