City of San Dimas Office of the City Manager – Update March 20, 2020

Latest Updates:

- On Thursday, March 19, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom issued Executive Order N-33-20, which requires all individuals in the State of California to stay at home except as needed to maintain continuity of operations of the federal critical infrastructures. This Order went into effect on March 19, 2020, and has no end date. All residents are directed to heed the current State public health directives immediately.
 - The Los Angeles County also issued an Executive Order in an effort to slow the spread of COVID-19. This Order went into effect on March 19, 2020, at 11:59 pm and applies through April 19, 2020.
 - Essential services that may remain open under Executive Order N-33-20:
 - Gas stations
 - Pharmacies
 - Food: grocery stores, farmers markets, food banks, convenience stores, take-out, and delivery restaurants
 - Banks
 - Laundromats/laundry services
 - Essential state and local government functions will also remain open, including law enforcement and offices that provide government programs and services
 - What's closed?
 - Dine-in restaurants
 - Bars and nightclubs
 - Entertainment venues
 - Gyms and fitness studios
 - Public and Private events and gatherings
 - Convention centers
 - Shopping Malls and Parks and playgrounds
 - Enforcement of this Order will be up to the Los Angeles Department of Public Health

- A quarantine center will be open beginning March 23 at the Sheraton Fairplex Hotel in Pomona for people who have tested positive or Covid-19 and for those who are showing symptoms and awaiting test results. The rooms will be filled on a first-come, first-serve basis.
 - Child care will be provided at the hotel for the children of first responders
 - The parking lot will have a drive-thru food bank for those in need
