City of San Dimas Office of the City Manager – Update April 28, 2020

Latest Updates:

- Governor Newsom announced details on how California plans to modify the Stay at Home order in the future. These modifications are based on science, health, and data and will happen in four stages:
 - Stage 1: Safety and Preparedness (this is where we are now) - Continue to build out testing, contact tracing, PPE, and hospital surge capacity. Continue to make essential workplace environments as safe as possible. Prepare sector by sector safety guidelines for expanded workforce
 - Stage 2: Lower Risk Workplaces – Gradually opening up some lower risk workplaces with adaptations (retail, manufacturing, offices, more public spaces)
 - Stage 3: Higher Risk Workplaces – Open higher risk workplaces with adaptations and limits on size of gatherings. Personal care (hair and nail salons, gyms), entertainment venues (movie theaters, sports without live audiences), in-person religious services (churches, weddings)
 - Stage 4: End of Stay-at-Home Order – Re-open highest risk environments and venues once therapeutics have been deployed (concerts, convention centers, live audience sports)
- Protect your pets if you are sick with COVID-19
 - Limit exposure to pets and have someone else care for them, if possible
 - If you must be around animals while sick, wash your hands before and after interacting with them
