City of San Dimas Office of the City Manager – Update May 27, 2020

Latest Updates:

- The most recent Los Angeles County Health Order was modified yesterday to align with the State's public health order in a phased approach to reopening. Notable changes include the following:
 - Allows for pools, hot tubs, and saunas that are in multi-unit residences or part of a homeowners' association, Apartment, or Condominium to be open
 - Non-essential office-based businesses can open, this includes faith-based office facilities
 - All retail can open at 50% capacity, this includes outdoor malls (swap meets). For indoor malls and shopping centers (defined as a building with 7 or more retail establishments) can open at 50% capacity
 - Allows people to obtain in person faith-based counseling services if it cannot be practiced remotely and is limited to 10 or fewer individuals
 - In person faith-based services are limited to 25% capacity or a max of 100, whichever is lower
 - In person protests allowed if limited to 25% of the area's capacity and 6 feet physical distancing is maintained at all times
 - Allows for the reopening of drive-in movie theaters
