- With the earthquake today in central California, it is an important reminder that earthquakes can strike at any moment. Download the “My Shake” app for your phone, which is an earthquake warning app. The app keeps you informed about earthquakes and monitors for them. - Governor Newsom signed an executive order that extends a waiver that allows retailers to temporarily pause in-store redemption of beverage containers to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. The order also temporarily suspends the requirement for recycling centers to hold a minimum number of hours of operation
