City of San Dimas Office of the City Manager – Update June 29, 2020

Latest Updates:

- Governor Newsom ordered the closure of bars for Los Angeles County, among other counties. This includes the closure of bars, brewpubs, pubs, wineries and tasting rooms unless they are offering sit-down dine-in meals, and the closing of bar areas in restaurants
 - The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health is guided by science and data and the key metrics monitored are showing concerning trends as there has been a sharp increase in new cases and hospitalizations
 - The timing of these increases is in line with the reopening of key sectors, including bars, which are places where people remove their face covering to drink while they may be socializing with people not in their households

- The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) is reminding residential and business customers served by the 909-area code to prepare for the introduction of the new 840 area code next month.
 - The 840-area code will be added as an overlay to the 909 regions to ensure a continuing supply of telephone numbers for the area
 - Unlike the previous 909 area code split in 1998 that required some customers to change their area code, the 909/840 area code overlay will not require customers to change their existing area code. However, the overlay will require customers to dial “1” plus the three-digit area code for all calls from telephone numbers with the 909 and 840 area codes, including local calls
 - Beginning July 25, 2020, customers with a 909-area code telephone number may begin to use this new dialing procedure to place telephone calls. The new dialing procedure will become mandatory for all customers with a 909-area code telephone number starting January 23, 2021
