City of San Dimas Office of the City Manager – Update June 4, 2020

Latest Updates:

- San Dimas City Hall will reopen to the public on Monday, June 8, and will be open to residents during regular operating hours. Monday – Thursday 7:30 am – 5:30 pm and Fridays from 7:30 am – 4:30 pm
 - Social distancing will be enforced, and the City will require that anyone visiting City Hall has a face covering on
 - Anyone who feels unwell or is experiencing a fever, cough, or shortness of breath, is asked to stay home and please not enter City Hall
 - If you cannot come into City Hall and need to make payment for specific permits, plan checks, tax payments, or a business license, you can do so on our website at <https://sandimasca.gov>
 - While City Hall is reopening, all other San Dimas public facilities will continue to be closed to the public at this time under State and LA County guidelines until further notice. This includes the following facilities:
 - Stanley Plummer Community Building
 - Senior Center/Community Center
 - San Dimas Recreation Center
 - Marchant Park Community Center
 - Ladera Serra Community Center
 - Call the Administration Department at (909) 394-6210 for additional questions
- Based on current situational awareness and the recent pattern of peaceful actions by protesters, the County did not issue a countywide curfew order for tonight
- With the earthquake last night near Ridgecrest, it is an important reminder that earthquakes can strike at any time, and it is crucial to be prepared and assemble an emergency supply kit. Essential supplies include:
 - Three-day supply of non-perishable food and one gallon of water per person, per day
 - Prescriptions or special medications
 - Change of clothing and closed-toe shoes
 - Extra eyeglasses or contacts
 - Extra set of car keys, credit cards, cash
 - First aid kit
 - Flashlight with extra batteries
 - Battery-powered radio and extra batteries
 - Sanitation supplies
 - Copies of important documents (birth certificates, passports, etc.)
 - Pet food and water
