Latest Updates:

- When visiting the San Dimas Dog Park, please adhere to all Dog Park guidelines to ensure a pleasant experience for all in attendance:
 - Dog Park hours are dawn to dusk (Dog Park is closed from 7a-9a Wednesdays)
 - Users must keep their dogs on leashes going to and from the leash-free area
 - Large dogs are expected to be in the large dog area, small dogs in the small dog area

- As health inspectors continue to conduct visits to ensure infection control measures are in place in businesses across the County, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) has created a tiered compliance and enforcement plan that will include citations and fines for businesses that continue to violate Health Officer Orders
 - Compliance with the Health Officer Orders is paramount for the long-term reopening of many economic sectors while ensuring the public health and safety of residents, which includes consumers and those who make up the workforce of these sectors.
 - Health Officer Orders are in place to prevent more cases, more severe illnesses, increased hospitalizations, and more deaths. Current Orders require business owners to close indoor operations at many businesses and take immediate action to implement strategies that protect workers and customers.

- LA County residents are urged to adhere to the County's [Health Order](#) in light of recent data which indicates COVID-19 is on track to become the second leading cause of deaths in LA County, and is quickly outpacing other illnesses, including the flu
 - Unlike the flu, there is no vaccine for COVID-19 at this time. This is one of the reasons LA County is working hard to flatten the curve and slow the spread of COVID-19. By doing so, we're able to limit the strain on LA County's health care system when flu season arrives in just a few months, and to contain a virus that we now understand is much more deadly than the flu
