Latest Updates:

- According to the South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD) forecast, air quality will be unhealthy tomorrow, Saturday, August 8 in East San Gabriel Valley
 - Los Angeles County Public Health advises people living or working in the these areas with heart disease, asthma or other respiratory diseases to minimize outdoor activities
 - Children who have sensitive conditions, including heart disease, asthma, and other chronic respiratory diseases, should not participate in outdoor physical activity and should stay indoors as much as possible
