Latest Updates:

Local:

- Please do not fly drones within or next to the area of the Bobcat Fire (or any wildfire). Drones create hazards for firefighting crews and prevent fire agencies from securing accurate and current data on burned acreage
- As a result of the Bobcat Fire and poor air quality in San Dimas, the pools at the San Dimas Recreation Center will be closed until Wednesday, September 16. City staff will reassess opening the pool at that time to ensure the safety of residents. You can also call (909) 394-6230 for updates regarding the re-opening

County:

- Applications for the Childcare Grant Program open on September 14 at noon. The Los Angeles County COVID-19 CARES Act Childcare Grant Program will provide grants of **\$10,000 or \$40,000** to eligible childcare operators in Los Angeles County who have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. - Today LA County announced a partnership with SafePass, a mobile app that provides contact tracing capabilities for individuals throughout LA County. SafePass will allow users to self-report their symptoms for COVID-19 and receive notifications and alerts directly from LA County Public Health. All contact tracing data is anonymous, private, encrypted, and deleted after 30 days. State:

- Testing results turnaround update: laboratories across the State are reporting results in 1.3 days. 66% of results are reported within one day, and 88% of results are reported within two days. For more information on testing turnaround time, visit the dashboard, which is available at <https://covid19.ca.gov/> and is updated weekly
- Air quality continues to remain at unhealthy levels throughout the State. Remember to stay indoors and keep windows closed, reduce physical activity, and check on your loved ones with lung and heart conditions. Monitor air quality by visiting <https://www.airnow.gov/>
- The State's average COVID-19 caseload is down 24% this week. The positivity rate is at 4% (the lowest since May). Hospital and ICU rates are down by 22%. Please continue to wear a mask and physically distance
- Today, approximately 14,000 firefighters remain on the line of 29 significant wildfires burning across California. Although 37 new fires were sparked yesterday, crews contained most of them quickly though two have grown to large wildfires.
