Local:

- Protect yourself and your loved ones by getting a flu shot early this year. The City of San Dimas, in conjunction with CVS Pharmacy, will be offering free flu shots on Thursday, September 24, from 10 am to 1 pm at the Community Health and Resource Fair held in Civic Center Plaza, 245 E. Bonita Ave. Vaccines will be available to anyone age three or older, including the specialized vaccines for those over 65 years of age. In addition to free flu shots, there will be information, community resources, and health booths. Pre-registration is recommended for the flu shots. - Bobcat Fire update: as of this morning, the Bobcat Fire is at 36,366 acres and 6% containment. The fire has crossed to the west side of Santa Anita Canyon and is growing in the direction of Mt. Wilson and Mt. Harvard
