Latest Updates:

Local:

- The City of San Dimas is excited to announce our 12 Days of San Dimas! Check out our website for more information about each day and to register for a selection of our events! <https://sandimasca.gov/12daysofsandimas/>
- The City of San Dimas will suspend the requirement for an overnight parking permit for the Thanksgiving holiday. The parking moratorium will begin Monday, November 23rd through Sunday, November 29th. The City will resume normal parking permit requirements effective immediately **Monday, November 30th, at 2 am.**
- It's time to renew your annual parking permits. Permit renewals received by November 30, 2020 will pay a renewal fee of \$24. City Hall will be **closed December 24th – January 1st**, therefore permit renewals received by January 8, 2021 will pay a renewal fee of \$32. Permits renewals received after January 8, 2021, will pay a renewal fee of \$40.

County:

- Los Angeles County Public Health Officials urge immediate action to slow the spread and stop the surge of COVID-19 cases.
- Here are some steps:
 - Stay at home as much as possible, except for essential services
 - Rethinking holiday plans and cancel traveling
 - Only gather outdoors with face coverings and physical distancing
 - Wearing face coverings and keep distance from high risk people
 - Quarantine if you are a close contact or have engaged in risky activities
- For Businesses:
 - Follow all safety protocols, ensure adherence to masking, infection control and distancing
 - Report outbreaks of 3 or more cases within 14 days by calling (888) 700-9995

State:

- Governor Newsom's briefing stated California is pulling an emergency brake due to the fast increase in cases in a previous week's time frame. Some counties will move multiple tiers back. These counties must make industry changes urgently, instead of three days. California will assess tiers again mid-week.
- Dr. Mark Ghaly, advises celebrating Thanksgiving with people within your household which includes discouraging non-essential out of state travel, 14-day self-quarantine after returning, and staying local.
